What is the PATH Project?

The **PATH (Planning a Transit Horizon) Project** represents our roadmap to a more connected and more convenient way to get around. Through this initiative, we are planning a transit horizon that addresses your needs today while anticipating the demands of tomorrow. Together, we are working to continue delivering a more innovative and seamless transit experience for every rider.

The study will evaluate ways to improve access to jobs, schools, and key destinations, strengthen coordination with nearby transit systems, and prepare for future growth and major regional events such as the 2026 FIFA World Cup, 2027 Super Bowl, and 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The goal of PATH is to build a modern, sustainable, and community-driven transit network that enhances mobility and quality of life well into the future.

Why is this study being conducted?

This study is being conducted to reassess GTrans services and ensure the system continues to meet the needs of the community. It will analyze ridership trends, enhance regional connections, and identify ways to make the system more efficient, reliable, and accessible.

What areas will this study focus on?

The study will focus on the GTrans service area, which includes Gardena and neighboring communities such as Compton, Inglewood, and Hawthorne, Torrance and areas of Unincorporated LA. The project will review GTrans' routes, schedules, and regional transit connections to identify opportunities for improvement.

How will this impact current Gtrans services?

Current GTrans services will continue as usual during the study. Any proposed changes will be developed through a comprehensive process that combines on-the-field data collection and analysis, multiple community events, active public participation, and extensive community feedback, ensuring that decisions are both evidence-based- and reflective of the needs and priorities of the communities served. Recommendations will be presented to the Gardena City Council for review and adoption before any adjustments are made.

How can I provide my input?

You can share your feedback by participating in public meetings, trying our interactive Bus Bucks Game and other engagement activities, completing surveys, leaving comment cards at pop-up events, or speaking with staff during transit intercept outreach at bus stops; visit www.ridegtrans.com/PATH for upcoming engagement opportunities.

Why is community feedback important?

Your input ensures that proposed improvements reflect the needs and experiences of riders, residents, businesses, and community organizations. Public participation helps design a system that works better for everyone.

Will there be public meetings?

How will this study improve transit access?

The study will explore ways to improve service frequency, expand routes, improve reliability, and strengthen connections with LA Metro and other municipal operators in the region.

How does this study address sustainability?

The study will identify opportunities to reduce environmental impacts, support clean mobility goals, and encourage more people to choose public transit as a convenient travel option.

How long will the study take?

The study is expected to take place in three phases, from winter 2026 to spring 2026, with opportunities for public input at each stage.

When will changes be implemented?

Implementation of any changes will depend on study findings, community feedback, and funding availability. After the final phase, recommendations will be shared publicly, and any proposed service changes will go through the official review and approval process, including consideration by the Gardena City Council to ensure alignment with community priorities.
